TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Junior Vagliano Trophy was created in January 2011 by the LGU and the European Golf Association and first played in June the same year. The event provides an ideal platform for introducing talented young golfers to the pressures and pleasures of team match play golf and helps supporting Girls' elite Golf. The JVT is played at the same time as the ladies' equivalent, the biennial Vagliano Trophy match.



SELECTION PROCEDURE

As with the Vagliano Trophy, team selection will be conducted by the LGU and EGA for the GB&I and Continent of Europe teams respectively. Updates on player progress will be available from the EGA website and enquirees as to prospective team members' availability will be made to the European national golf authorities during the selection period.



SYSTEM OF PLAY

12 girls, aged 16 and under, going head to head in four sets of matches over a two day period. All team members will play in two sets of three foursomes and two sets of six singles matches.

THE ROYAL ST. GEORGE'S GOLF CLUB

Founded in 1887 and intended by its founder, Dr William Laidlaw Purves, to be a rival to St Andrew's in the South of England, St George's is consistently ranked amongst the leading courses in the World.

The Club occupies a unique place in the history of golf, for it was here in 1894, that the Open Championship was first played outside Scotland.

In all there have been 14 Open Championships played at St George's, more than any course outside of Scotland.

The Open Championship returns to St George's for the 15th time in 2020, when the Club will host the 149th Open Championship
